The qualification is designed to provide the beauty sector with beauty service professionals who have fundamental beauty skills and knowledge to analyse, plan and competently provide a range of beauty services.

This qualification is intended for learners who wish to enter the beauty sector or pathway onto specialisation within the beauty sector. Graduates will be capable of working under broad guidance with a degree of self-management within a beauty services environment.

Graduates will support the social and cultural aspirations of Māori, Pasifika, and other communities through their interaction within beauty services.
