# **Guidance Information** Assessment conditions 1 Practices for first aid (knowledge and skills) must be consistent with in the current version of *First Aid as life Skill* document. This guideline is based on high-guality, peer-reviewed and published medical scientific research, and conforms to the relevant New Zealand legislation. It -and have-meets accreditation requirements of the Emergency Ambulance Service provisions of NZS 8156:2019. Competence will be demonstrated or described using a simulated first aid different scenarios developed by the training provider. At least one of these scenarios must include a situational hazard, and one must include loss of response when the patient is breathing normally (singly or in combination). Range person's condition includes - One trauma from - burns, fractures, soft tissue injuries, poisonings. Two medical conditions from - heart attack, asthma, stroke, seizure, diabetes. Aaccepted practices for first aid include - recognising when to call for help, and simple management of condition(s). The training provider's assessment or scenario checklist must make reference to the Danger, Response, Send for help, Airway, Breathing, Circulation, and Defibrillation action plan ('DRSABCD') - noting that the person is breathing and contain scenariospecific information on how each first aid situation and each person's injuries and medical conditions are expected to be managed.

The assessment or scenario checklistis information may cover aspects such as the environment, number of people injured or unwell, number and description of

bystanders, if an Automated External Defibrillator ('AED') ED is available for use or not, treatment of injuries and what the learner is expected to do in each situation.

 Accepted practices for first aid include – recognising when to call for help, simple management of condition(s).

Each scenario must contain one person whose condition is assessed and managed until help arrives. Scenario descriptors must contain sufficient information (such as signs or symptoms) to allow the learner to recognise the condition they are expected to manage.
