The purpose of this qualification is to provide the Offender Management sector with frontline staff who have the foundation knowledge, skills, and behaviours to deliver <u>safety</u>, security care and prisoner rehabilitation and <u>support</u> reintegration functions in a New Zealand prison environment.

Graduates will be able to operate with limited supervision in varying frontline roles such as Corrections Officers, or Corrections Instructors, or Reintegration Officers in a New Zealand prison environment.
