- Importance of communication systems, and flow of information in coordinating emergency response activities.
- Overview of communication systems, including physical systems (radios, satellite phones), inter-agency communication systems, and public-facing systems like PIMS (Public Information Management Systems).

Emergency response operations

- Basic actions and facilities in emergency response
- Introduction to the facilities used in emergency response operations.
- Explanation of how these facilities manage resources and coordinate activities across different levels of response.
- Basic steps for mobilising resources during a response, including coordination with local, regional, and national entities.

Transition from emergency response to recovery

- Definition and role of recovery in emergency management.
- Understanding how the response phase transitions into recovery, and how this process supports community resilience and recovery efforts.
