This standard aligns with the outcomes of the New Zealand Certificate in Prisoner Management (Level 3) [Ref: 2658].

#### Definitions:

- Gangs refer to an organisation, association, or group which has a common name and one or more
  common identifiers. Members or associations either individually or collectively, promote,
  encourage, and engage in criminal activity driven by a desire for financial gain and/or to create an
  atmosphere of fear and intimidation which is enabled by gang membership.
- A prison environment refers to a setting that replicates the conditions, structure, and dynamics of
  a correctional facility. This includes actual prisons, and any time prisoners are managed outside of
  the confines of a prison.
