OUTCOME STATEMENT/TE TAUĀKI Ā-HUA

Strategic Purpose statement/ Te rautaki o te tohu

The purpose of this qualification is to provide the pharmacy sector with specialist pharmacy technicians who carry out a range of specialist pharmacy services. This qualification is intended for people who are already operating as pharmacy technicians, and who are intending to enter into an operational/management/leadership specialist pharmacy technician role.

- Apply in-depth knowledge of the New Zealand healthcare system and the interaction between healthcare providers to support the delivery of a range of pharmacy services.
