Assessment specifications:

- Assessment criteria 2c support provided is community led and addresses specific needs of individuals and whanau.

Definitions

- *Community* refers to a group of people connected by location, culture, workplace or institution, shared experience and or interests.
- Person-centred preparedness acknowledges that each individual's circumstances are unique, that people are the experts of their own lives, but may need support to develop and implement personalised preparedness plans.
- Priority populations refers to individuals or groups who are at higher risk of harm, adverse
 outcomes, or barriers to accessing support before, during, or after an emergency or disaster.
 Increased risk factors may be due to physical, social, economic, or cultural factors.
