For assessment purposes:

- Assessment must comply with the latest version of the First Aid as a Life Skill, available from Toitū
 Te Waiora at https://toitutewaiora.nz/first-aid-as-a-life-skill/
- Competence must be demonstrated in a simulated emergency situation via demonstration on another person or manikin.
- Assessment criterion 1a must follow the *Dangers, Response, Send for help, Airway, Breathing, CPR, Defibrillation* (DRSABCD) mnemonic, including checking for scene safety, assessing responsiveness, sending for help, opening and checking the airway, checking for breathing, performing Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), and use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). Demonstration must be performed on either an adult or a child in its entirety, and on an infant, with the exception of AED use.
- Assessment criterion 1b must include the management of a foreign body airway obstruction.
 Demonstration must be performed on either an adult or a child, and on an infant.
- Assessment criterion 1c must identify and manage severe and life-threatening bleeding, and use
 of a tourniquet.
- Assessment criterion 1d must include demonstration of placing a collapsed person who is unresponsive and breathing normally in the stable-side / recovery position.

Definitions:

• Age ranges are defined in *First Aid as a Life Skill* as adult (aged eight years or over), child (aged between one and eight years of age), and infant (younger than one year old).
