Operate emergency communications centre technology

Whāinga Purpose	<p>This standard is for emergency communications centre personnel who respond to emergency calls.</p> <p>People credited with this standard will be able to: operate a computer aided dispatch (CAD) system at an emergency communications centre; use emergency communication centre communications equipment; and read and interpret maps to support operations from an emergency communications centre.</p> <p>This skill standard aligns with the outcomes of the <i>New Zealand Certificate in Emergency Communications Centres (Level 3) with optional strand in Dispatch</i>.</p>

Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

- Assessment must be in accordance with organisational requirements and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP).

- Assessment against this standard may take place under real or simulated conditions.

Definitions:

- *Emergency* refers to a time critical situation where life and/or property are at risk.
- *Emergency Communications Centre* refers to a communications centre that acts as a first point of contact between the public and emergency services.
- *Emergency services* refer to New Zealand Police, Fire and Emergency New Zealand, and ambulance services (Hato Hone St John and Wellington Free Ambulance).

- Functions of an emergency communications centre CAD system.
- Emergency communications call system functions: incoming calls, outgoing calls, conference calls, holding calls, muting calls, transferring calls, phone queues, operators, clerical time.
- Auxiliary emergency communications equipment: mobile phones, intranet, internet, SMS (short messaging service), video calls, email, satellite phone, VOIP phones, teletype (TTY), 111 txt.
- Emergency communications centre equipment testing procedures and frequency, and back up procedures.
- Accessing and logging mapping systems.
- Features on maps, calculating grid references, fixing accurate locations.
- Software and tools for location verification.
