Assessment specifications:

- Assessment must be in accordance with organisational requirements and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP).
- Assessment against this standard may take place under real or simulated conditions.

#### Definitions:

- Emergency refers to a time critical situation where life and/or property are at risk.
- Emergency Communications Centre refers to a communications centre that acts as a first point of contact between the public and emergency services.
- Emergency services refer to New Zealand Police, Fire and Emergency New Zealand, and ambulance services (Hato Hone St John and Wellington Free Ambulance).

#### Ihirangi waitohu | Indicative content

- Definitions: hazard, risk, threat, and safety in emergency contexts.
- Common incident scene hazards: fire, dangerous goods, hazardous substances, armed offenders, unstable structures, electricity, weather.
- Dynamic nature of incident scenes: how risks can change over time.
- Risks to responders, callers, and the public.
- Escalation protocols when threats exceed standard operational thresholds.
- Transfer or refer to other agencies: Police, Fire, Ambulance, Civil Defence and Emergency
  Management, District Health Boards, territorial and local authorities, New Zealand Defence
  Force, Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Authority, Coastguard, Rescue Coordination
  Centre, search extrication teams, chemical biological nuclear response teams, specialist squad
- Safety and care instruction for dispatchers, responding personnel, supervisors, other agencies.
- Communication protocols: Standard operating procedures for relaying safety warnings, common scripts or structured phrases used for known risk types.
- Recording risks and actions taken for post-incident analysis.
- Using feedback to improve communication in future risk scenarios.
- Learning from critical incidents and near misses.
